know. You will need your passport to enter Canada.



## Help Keep Our Kitchen Clean

- All food that is put in the fridge must be labeled with the date. Stickers are on the fridge door. Please wrap all food and put a label on with the date.
- Raw foods need to be on the bottom shelf of the fridge.
- Check food in the fridge periodically and throw out anything that is past its expiration date.
- If you bring food for coffee hour it's best to bring home or give away leftovers. The exception to this is cakes, fruits or veggies or other small items that can be eaten during weekday classes
- Wash all dishes before putting in the sanitizer. Follow signs above sink for proper washing. (The disposal is currently broken—do not use.)
- The health department prohibits the use of sponges or dish towels.
- Put recycling in the recycling container and all returnable bottles in a separate bag next to recycling.
- Empty garbage in the dumpster, especially if it contains food scraps. Recycling can be emptied into blue containers next to dumpster but do not throw plastic bags in the recycling container—they must go in the garbage dumpster.
