House Blessings

Fr. Luke will be scheduling house blessings. Do not be afraid to call Father to schedule a time. Please keep your calendar open and flexible. Please have the following prepared:

- Have a table or family icon corner set up with a white cloth, candle and a bowl for Holy Water.
- Turn off televisions, radios, and stereos
- 3) Take the telephone off the receiver
- Gather the family together
- Do bring any items you want blessed and names of people for Father to remember at liturgy

PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR THE BLESSING:

- 1) Your home does NOT have to be spotless, but should be free of clutter on the floor, like toys, which may cause Father to trip or fall.
- 2) A table should be prepared where an icon, a candle, a small bowl, holy water and a list of first names of everyone you want Father to pray for during the service for their health. If you do not have Holy Water, please let Father know and he will bring a bottle of for you to keep.
- 3) If you have any small items, like crosses or icons, that you want blessed, place them on the table and let Father know.
- 4) Turn off all radios and TVs. Take the phone off the hook during the short blessing

- service. Cell phones should be turned off. Just remember to place the phone back on the hook and turn on your cell phone at the end of the service.
- 5) Close all doors to rooms you do not want Father to enter -- open all doors and turn the lights on in the home, otherwise.
- 6) A family member should lead Father around the home during the blessing. Children may do this, girls or boys.
- 7) If you have a pet, they may also receive a blessing, but please keep them under control to prevent them from jumping on Father or getting under his feet.
- 8) I look forward to sharing this special blessing with you and your family. Many Years!!

Praying some more

Have you ever asked your parents for something...and then asked them again and again until they finally gave it to you? Sometimes they might give in, only after you've asked them more than once.

In today's Gospel reading, we hear about a blind man who wanted to be healed. When Jesus walked by, this blind man cried out to the Lord, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then again, the man shouted, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Later, when Jesus stopped and asked him what he wanted, he answered, God always listens to our prayers! "Lord, let me receive my sight." This poor man asked the Lord three times for His help.

When we pray to God, sometimes we ask Him for something more than once. Sometimes you might pray for something for years! Why doesn't God listen to us the first time? Well, He does listen to us...always. But He also wants us to be persistent. That means that He wants us to keep asking for something. When we keep praying to God, we have God in our minds and in our hearts, right? We cling to Him. We look to Him for help. We think about Him. We can look to this blind man in the Gospel as an example. We can keep turning to God for help!

THE CHAINS OF SAINT PETER

Have you celebrated a saint's day? Your nameday, or a friend's? Did you know that sometimes we celebrate feastdays for events, things that happened in our Church's long history?

Have you heard the story of St. Peter's chains? St. Peter was busy in Rome, telling people all about Christ—and lots of people were becoming Christians. Lots of people were learning to believe in Jesus Christ and getting baptized, too.

The king did not like this, and so he threw St. Peter into prison. He was chained up, with a prison guard on each side of him. Did he have any chance of escaping? Not at all! But during the night, an angel told St. Peter to get up. The chains fell from him, and St. Peter left the prison cell!

But what happened to the chains? Christians knew that these chains were special because they had once touched St. Peter. They were all a part of this big miracle that God had let happen. So they brought sick people to touch the chains, and they were healed!

You can still find these chains at a church in Rome, Italy. Don't miss them! If you see them one day, you'll remember this wonderful miracle. And you'll remember that nobody can stop the power of God!
