House Blessings

Fr. Luke will be scheduling house blessings. Do not be afraid to call Father to schedule a time. Please keep your calendar open and flexible. Please have the following prepared:

- Have a table or family icon corner set up with a white cloth, candle and a bowl for Holy Water.
- Turn off televisions, radios, and stereos
- 3) Take the telephone off the receiver
- Gather the family together
- Do bring any items you want blessed and names of people for Father to remember at liturgy

PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR THE BLESSING:

- 1) Your home does NOT have to be spotless, but should be free of clutter on the floor, like toys, which may cause Father to trip or fall.
- 2) A table should be prepared where an icon, a candle, a small bowl, holy water and a list of first names of everyone you want Father to pray for during the service for their health. If you do not have Holy Water, please let Father know and he will bring a bottle of for you to keep.
- 3) If you have any small items, like crosses or icons, that you want blessed, place them on the table and let Father know.
- 4) Turn off all radios and TVs. Take the phone off the hook during the short blessing

- service. Cell phones should be turned off. Just remember to place the phone back on the hook and turn on your cell phone at the end of the service.
- 5) Close all doors to rooms you do not want Father to enter -- open all doors and turn the lights on in the home, otherwise.
- 6) A family member should lead Father around the home during the blessing. Children may do this, girls or boys.
- 7) If you have a pet, they may also receive a blessing, but please keep them under control to prevent them from jumping on Father or getting under his feet.
- 8) I look forward to sharing this special blessing with you and your family. Many Years!!

The Diocesan Chancery is pleased to announce that registration is now open for the **2018 CrossRoad** program. CrossRoad is a ten-day academic summer institute that prepares high school juniors and seniors to make big life decisions and invites them to connect with the Orthodox Christian theological and spiritual tradition. Participants from all over the country come together to experience daily worship, take theology classes from some of the best professors in the country, visit local parishes, serve their neighbor, tour the city, and even spend a day at the beach. Historically, CrossRoad has been hosted solely on the campus of Hellenic College Holy Cross. This year, we are excited to announce that CrossRoad is expanding to Chicago! This summer, there will be a third session offered on the campus of North Park University in Chicago, IL.

CrossRoad Chicago is the same program, run by the same staff, in a brand new location! The sessions are as follows: Session 1 - June 16 – June 26 (Boston) Session 2 July 2 – July 12 (Boston) Session 3 - July 21 – July 31 (Chicago)

Scholarships covering the registration and tuition fee will be available to our Diocesan students who apply and are accepted to any one of the three sessions.

For the Children

Have you ever gotten a message? A letter, a phone call, an email, a text message? Was it a good message, or was it something you didn't want to hear? What did you think of the news you received?

Just this week, we will celebrate the great feastday of Theophany, when our Lord Jesus Christ was baptized by Saint John. Today in the Gospel, we hear a little bit about Saint John and the message he brought to all the people.

The Gospel tells us, "As it is written in the prophets, 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who shall prepare your way; the voice of one crying in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." These words were written hundreds of years before Christ came to earth, but when we read these words, we know God's plan!

God planned to send a messenger before our Lord, Jesus Christ, came. Do you know who that messenger is? It's Saint John! Saint John was the messenger who brought the best message—the message that the Lord is coming!

This week, when we celebrate the wonderful feast, let's remember God's big plan, and His messenger, Saint John, who brought the news!

HOW DO WE CELEBRATE THEOPHANY?

Orthodox Christians celebrate Theophany on January 6th. On this day, we hold a special service called the "Blessing of the Waters." If you go to church, you can drink a little of the holy water. The priest will give you a little bottle of holy water to take home with you, too. Along with this wonderful tradition in the church, here are some other ways that Orthodox Christians celebrate this great feast!

In Greece, Bulgaria, and Cyprus, the priest throws a cross into the water. Lots of people jump into the cold water. Whoever brings it back first is said to get a special blessing for the year.

In Romania, people compete in a big horse race! The priest blesses the horse riders with holy water, and then they are off! Afterwards, everyone celebrates the feast together.

In Russia, it is very cold in the winter. But that doesn't stop people from jumping in icy water. In some places, people cut a hole in the ice in the shape of a cross. Then people jump in.

On Theophany, thousands and thousands of Orthodox Christians visit the place where Jesus was baptized. They go to the Jordan River, near the city of Jericho. Some people who want to be baptized do so on this holy day.

But the best way to celebrate is by going to church, thanking God for giving us the Holy Spirit and His Son, Jesus Christ!

We celebrate Holy Theophany on Saturday, January 6th (Jan, 19 OC).
