Lenten Fast

The following minimal fasting regulations are designated for our clergy and faithful for Great Lent:

1) Great and Holy Friday, and Great and Holy Saturday, namely April 6 and 7 are days of strict abstinence. On these days, no meat or dairy products may be eaten.

2) Meat and meat products may not be eaten during all of Holy Week, namely April 2 through April 7.

These are the minimal requirements to observe during this Season. But for those of stronger body and more willing spirit, I wholeheartedly recommend the penitential practices of a sterner quality which the time-honored traditions and customs of our Holy Orthodox Church have handed down to us.

<u>Following Christ – today and always!</u> By <u>Presvytera Alexandra Houck</u> in <u>The</u> <u>Children's Word</u>

Today is Palm Sunday! This is the day we celebrate when our Lord, Jesus Christ came into Jerusalem. This was a big celebration for Jesus's followers then, and it still is a big celebration for Jesus's followers today!

Lots and lots of people lined up to welcome Christ into Jerusalem. They waved palm branches just like we wave our flags in a 4th of July parade. They even spread their clothes on the ground so the donkey could walk on them!

So many people cheered for Christ on Palm Sunday. But do you remember what happens at the end of the week? Jesus, our Lord, is put to death and is crucified. And who is with Him at the end? When He was on the Cross, just a few people were with Him—His mother, His disciple (John), and a few women. That wasn't the great crowd of people who were with Him had when He entered Jerusalem!

Let's always remember to try to be with our Lord, Jesus Christ, ALWAYS! Let's be with Him not just when it is popular, but even when it is not popular. Let's stick with Him when it is easy and when it is hard. Let's turn to Him today on Palm Sunday and on Holy Friday, too! After all, He is with US always.

BLESSED JOSEPH WHO FORGAVE HIS BROTHERS

Tomorrow we begin Holy Week, and on each day of Holy Week we remember something or somebody different. Tomorrow, on Holy Monday, we remember Blessed Joseph.

Have you heard the story of St. Joseph (not the one who took care of Mary, the Theotokos)? This is the Joseph from the Old Testament, the one who lived more than a thousand years before Christ was born.

Joseph had eleven brothers. They were jealous of Joseph because their father, Jacob, loved him so much. The brothers took Joseph one day, threw him in a pit, and then sold him into slavery! But many years later, the brothers found Joseph, and they didn't recognize him. Joseph forgave his brothers, even though they had treated him so horribly. He saves his brothers from hunger.

Why do we remember Blessed Joseph tomorrow, on Holy Monday? Because when we think of Joseph's story, we think of our Lord, Jesus Christ's story. His own people treated Him so horribly too. But in the end, He forgives all, and wants to save us all too!
