Bear the burdens by Presvytera Alexandra Houck in The Children's Word

Have you ever carried something heavy for somebody? Maybe something for a younger brother or sister? Or maybe for an older person? It probably helped the other person, but did it make you happy to be able to help?

In the epistle reading today, Saint Paul gives some good advice to us. He writes, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." Bear a burden. What does that mean? It means carrying something heavy for somebody else. Sometimes we really do carry something. But we also bear somebody's burdens when we take away things that are hard for somebody. We help somebody who needs help.

Every day, we can think of ways we can bear somebody's burdens...how we can make things easier for others. Holding the door open for somebody. Helping your parents clean up. Sharing an umbrella with a friend in the rain. Explaining how to do a math problem for a classmate. Sharing your money or your toys with somebody who doesn't have any. When we help others with their burdens, with things that are hard for them, we follow the law of Christ. And always remember, the law is to love our neighbor!

When was the last time you were all alone, out in the woods? Maybe you went for a hike? Or maybe you went camping? It's very peaceful out there, but after a while you probably wanted to be with other people!

Saint Sergius of Radonezh (in Russia) was born 700 years ago, but we still remember him in our Church. We remember him because he did so much to help people grow closer to Christ!

Saint Sergius wanted to spend time in quiet prayer, so he started to live out in the wilderness, far away from other people. But people found out about him, and they knew he was a holy man. They wanted to learn from him, and they wanted to find out how they could grow closer to our Lord, too. After a while, Saint Sergius sent some of his followers out to different parts of Russia. They started more than 400 monasteries, places where people could pray and learn more about God.

That first monastery that Saint Sergius started was once out in the woods, away from everybody. But now it is huge place with many churches and monks, and lots of visitors too!

We celebrate Saint Sergius of Radonezh today, July 5th.
