Lenten Fast

As we begin Lent together, the following minimal fasting regulations are designated for our clergy and faithful:

- The following days are days of strict abstinence; Great and Holy Friday, and Great and Holy Saturday, namely April 26 and 27 are days of strict abstinence. On these days, no meat or dairy products may be eaten.
- All Wednesdays and Fridays during this entire Season are days of abstinence from meat.
- Meat and meat products may not be eaten during all of Holy Week, namely April 22 through April 27.
- For the evening Presanctified Liturgy, a minimum three-hours fast from all food and drink

must be observed before the reception of Holy Communion. Normal fasting from midnight is still practiced before the Liturgies of St. John Chrysostom and St. Basil the Great.

These are the minimal requirements to observe during this Season. But for those of stronger body and more willing spirit, I wholeheartedly recommend the penitential practices of a sterner quality which the time-honored traditions and customs of our Holy Orthodox Church have handed down to us.

| Red Eggs

Have you ever not understood something at first, but then you did later? Maybe you heard somebody say something, but it didn't mean anything to you...but then later, you really got it.

Today, on this wonderful feast of Palm Sunday, the Gospel reading tells us how our Lord entered Jerusalem. When the crowds heard that Jesus was coming, they waved palm branches and cheered Him on! "And Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it, as it is written, 'Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

Those words were written many, many years before Jesus Christ lived on earth. In fact, Jesus's disciples had probably heard them when they had heard the scripture! But it didn't mean anything to them. The Gospel reading today tells us, "His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him." Later on, they really got it!

We don't always understand the Bible at first either! Let's keep reading it, again and again, so we can make connections, and we can understand more and more of God's message to us!

ST. KASSIANI – THE HYMN WRITER

Today is a happy day, a big feast day in our Church. But tomorrow, things are different. We start to think about all the sad things that happened to our Lord, Jesus Christ. Once, Jesus was talking to His disciples, and a woman came up and asked Him to forgive her. She even cleaned His feet with her hair!

Long ago (1,200 years ago!) a saint named Kassiani wrote a hymn about that story. And on Tuesday night, we will hear this same hymn, written so long ago.

Saint Kassiani was a very beautiful young woman, but she was smart too. When the emperor decided he wanted to get married, she was one of the "bride show." There were some young women, and the emperor was supposed to pick one of them for his bride!

But Kassiani had other ideas. She wanted to live for Christ, not for the emperor and all his fancy things. She started a monastery, where she wrote many hymns. On Tuesday, we hear the hymn that she is most famous for writing. But did you know that she also wrote a hymn for the service on Christmas Eve? She also wrote a long set of hymns for memorial services, when we remember somebody who has died. So Saint Kassiani keeps giving us her wonderful gifts of beautiful hymns...especially on Holy Tuesday!
