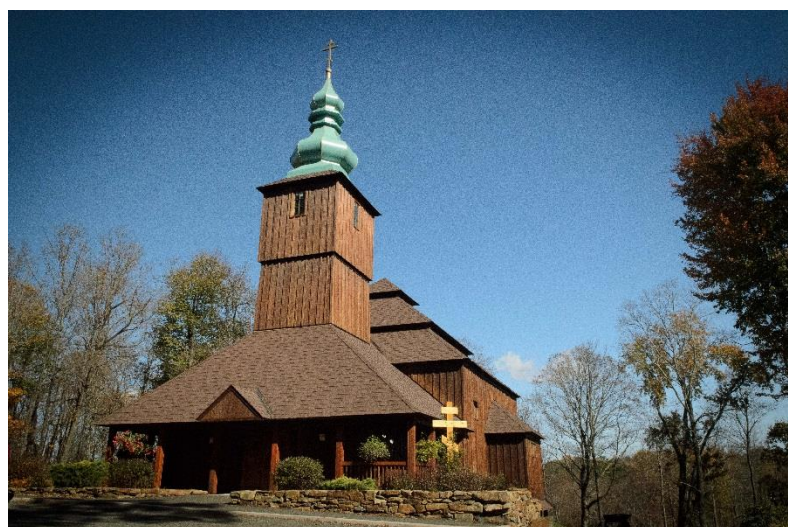
Welcome to Holy Trinity Parish

CHANGE our Bottom Line

Change Our Bottom Line—We cashed in the change in the extra mortgage principle jar this week and the total was \$95.76. This amount was added to other money from other donations and our Chow Down fundraiser toward the mortgage principal. A **total payment of \$1,241** was made directly to the principal of the new rectory mortgage in 2019. According to the bank, 2 extra mortgage payments a year could result in a savings of \$31,700 and reduce the duration of the mortgage by 4 years, 8 months; extra payments of \$3,000 per year could potentially reduce the loan term by 10 years, 6 months. Let's keep it up!

House Blessings

Fr. Luke will be scheduling house blessings. Do not be afraid to call Father to schedule a time. Please keep your calendar open and flexible. Please have the following prepared:

- 1) Have a table or family icon corner set up with a white cloth, candle and a bowl for Holy Water.
- 2) Turn off televisions, radios, and stereos
- 3) Take the telephone off the receiver
- 4) Gather the family together
- 5) Do bring any items you want blessed and names of people for Father to remember at liturgy

PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR THE BLESSING:

1) Your home does NOT have to be spotless, but should be free of clutter on the floor, like toys, which may cause Father to trip or fall.

2) A table should be prepared where an icon, a candle, a small bowl, holy water and a list of first names of everyone you want Father to pray for during the service for their health. If you do not have Holy Water, please let Father know and he will bring a bottle of for you to keep.

3) If you have any small items, like crosses or icons, that you want blessed, place them on the table and let Father know.

4) Turn off all radios and TVs. Take the phone off the hook during the short blessing service. Cell phones should be turned off. Just remember to

place the phone back on the hook and turn on your cell phone at the end of the service.

5) Close all doors to rooms you do not want Father to enter -- open all doors and turn the lights on in the home, otherwise.

6) A family member should lead Father around the home during the blessing. Children may do this, girls or boys.

7) If you have a pet, they may also receive a blessing, but please keep them under control to prevent them from jumping on Father or getting under his feet.

8) I look forward to sharing this special blessing with you and your family. Many Years!!

Council Positions Open—We have several council positions that need to be filled this year. They include President, Vice President, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Member at Large. Below are job descriptions for the President and Member at Large Position. The parish council meets monthly to discuss the business of the parish. Please consider giving some of your time and talent to a council position. If you have questions about a position, talk to any board member.

President: *Set the agenda for monthly parish council meetings and annual and semi-annual meetings.

- Lead parish and parish council meetings and see that decisions made for the parish are carried out.
- Sign official documents of the parish and checks as needed.

Member at Large: *Assist the Council Officers as requested.

- Act as liaison between the Parish Members and the Council.
- Participate in monthly meetings to discuss parish business.

Treasurer

Tasks on a weekly basis (approximately 2 hours):

- Get mail from church and review for payment either through electronic payment or by mail.
- Process all payments required for that week which can be via automatic transaction electronically or via USPS.
- Ensure there is enough money in accounts to make payments and if not transfer between accounts using online banking.
- Record all deposits by and track income and how it is dispersed to budget accounts
- Record donations by parish members for end of year tax letters
- Keep up filing of Bills etc. in file cabinet in church basement

Tasks on a Monthly basis (approximately 2 hours):

- Reconcile bank statements
- Reconcile credit card statements
- Prepare monthly bank balance report and budget vs. actual report for council meetings

Tasks for Semiannual meeting:

- Summarize and report financial status of all accounts to parishioners at semiannual meeting.

Tasks Beginning of each year:

- Create updated budget for new fiscal year
- Summarize and report financial status of all accounts to parishioners at annual meeting
- Calculate and distribute donation letters to parishioners for taxes

Tasks on a as needed basis

- Keep record and budget of any "special" or capital expenditure project as directed by the parish council.
- Archive all records so available for audit.

Skills:

Must have a computer and ability to do online banking

Must be able to use Excel or suitable program for reporting financial numbers and keeping track of donations

Must be able to use financial software to keep track of all accounts and distributions of income and expenses.
