CHANGE our Bottom Line Change Our Bottom Line—We cashed in the change in the extra mortgage principle jar this week and the total was \$95.76. This amount was added to other money from other donations and our Chow Down fundraiser toward the mortgage principal. A total payment of \$1,241 was made directly to the principal of the new rectory mortgage in 2019. According to the bank, 2 extra mortgage payments a year could result in a savings of \$31,700 and reduce the duration of the mortgage by 4 years, 8 months; extra payments of \$3,000 per year could potentially reduce the loan term by 10 years,

6 months. Let's keep it up!

Lenten Fast

As we begin Lent together, the following minimal fasting regulations are designated for our clergy and faithful:

- Monday, March 1 (Clean Monday), the first day of the Fast, is a day of strict abstinence; likewise Great and Holy Friday, and Great and Holy Saturday, namely April 17 and 18 are days of strict abstinence. On these days, no meat or dairy products may be eaten.
- All Wednesdays and Fridays during this entire Season are days of abstinence from meat.
- Meat and meat products may not be eaten during all of Holy Week, namely April 13 through April 18.
- For the evening Presanctified Liturgy, a minimum three-hours fast

from all food and drink must be observed before the reception of Holy Communion. Normal fasting from midnight is still practiced before the Liturgies of St. John Chrysostom and St. Basil the Great.

These are the minimal requirements to observe during this Season. But for those of stronger body and more willing spirit, I wholeheartedly recommend the penitential practices of a sterner quality which the time-honored traditions and customs of our Holy Orthodox Church have handed down to us.

On weekdays (Monday to Friday inclusive) during the seven weeks of Lent, there are restrictions both on the *number* of meals taken daily and on the

types of food permitted; but when a meal is allowed, there is no fixed limitation on the quantity of food to be eaten.

[This material is taken from the introduction to The Lenten Triodion. In modern practice, the above rules tend to be somewhat relaxed, and they have always been relaxed for children and the infirm. Fast as you are able, and consult Fr. Luke as needed. As you eat less physical food, it is important to increase your intake of spiritual food – prayer and reading scripture and the fathers of the Church.]

> Place your palm branches and pussywillows behind an icon at home and in your car!

Refrain from TV, Internet & Phones to honor Christ's Death.
