Orthodox Youth Mission Team Leaving for West

Virginia -- The Orthodox Youth Mission Team this will be traveling Saturday, July 9 through Sunday, July 17 to West Virginia to put their Faith to work, bringing love, hope and home repair help to families in Clay County. There are 19 dedicated adults and teens traveling from at multiple parishes in Connecticut and New York. We will be meeting up with additional team members from St. George's Greek Orthodox Church in Bethesda, Maryland. Our group from Connecticut will be stopping at Morgantown, WV for Liturgy on our way down at our diocesan parish of St. Mary's Orthodox Church and on our way back, we will worship with St. Michael's Church in St. Clair, PA. This is the mission team's 12th year and our 9th trip. We have traveled to many parts of Appalachia and also to Alaska to serve through OCMC. We had two years we were unable to travel due to COVID. These years we served locally in our parish and participated in some virtual mission trips in association with OCMC and an orphanage in Albania.
