

In the reading, we hear how Saint Paul visited some followers of John the Baptist. He asked



them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" And they answered, "No, we have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." These believers knew about baptism. They followed Saint John the Baptist. They knew about Jesus Christ. But they hadn't even heard of the Holy Spirit.

Saint Paul baptized them. Then the Holy Spirit came on them.

In our Church, we still need the Holy Spirit too. We can build a church building, but we need the Holy Spirit to give us life. We can have the Bible, but we need the Holy Spirit to use it. We can read the Creed, but we need the Holy Spirit to help us to have faith. We need the Holy Spirit to give us power to go, to really work...kind of like the batteries in your toys!

Brown Recluse spider, haven't you? It's a poisonous spider that likes to be left alone. Nobody likes those, but did you know recluses can be good, too? This week we'll celebrate the feastday of Saint Theophan the Recluse. He's named after Theophany, the feastday we celebrated yesterday.

St. Theophan was a Russian saint who spent the last 20 years of his life all by himself, not talking or visiting almost anybody!

But what did St. Theophan do when he was all by himself? Mostly, he prayed! He wrote books too, so that he could help people who

needed advice. St. Theophan taught many people how to do what St. Paul told us to do. St. Paul told us to "pray without stopping." St. Theophan wrote about how we can do that!
