Dorothy Day—Our next date to serve at Dorothy Day will be Friday, April 12th from 1:30-4:30 p.m. Last Friday we served over 140 meals to those in need in our community. This number is DOUBLE what it was when we first started serving at the soup kitchen. There are two ways to help, by serving at the soup kitchen--no experience needed—or by preparing large casseroles that we can use to feed the guests. If you've been thinking about getting involved in this ministry, now is a great time! You can serve for all or part of the afternoon. Service hours available for high school students. Game Dinner Help Needed—

Our annual Wild Game and Ethnic Food dinner will take place in just a few weeks on Sat. March 2nd starting at 6 p.m. This is our major winter fundraiser and there are lots of ways to participate! We are in need of the following:

- Cooks—see sign up sheet in the hall or talk to Fr. Luke about what you can make
- Donate items—not a chef? No problem! There are several items needed to be purchased for the dinner. Donated items reduce our cost. See sign-up sheet in the hall.
- Raffles—we are looking for raffle items and raffle baskets for the game dinner. Gift certificates, baskets of cheer, children's baskets, cook's baskets, hunter baskets—these are just a few ideas. It's family friendly event so whatever you come up with someone will love!
- Help at the event—set up will take place on Friday, March 2nd at 11 a.m. We will also need people at the game dinner to help cook, serve, clean up and sell raffles.

Thanks in advance for your generous donation of your time, talents and treasure!

Fr. Luke is scheduling house blessings. Do not be afraid to call Father to schedule a time. Please keep your calendar open and flexible. Please have the following prepared:

- 1) Have a table or family icon corner set up with a white cloth, candle and a bowl for Holy Water.
- 2) Turn off televisions, radios, and stereos
- 3) Take the telephone off the receiver
- 4) Gather the family together
- 5) Do bring any items you want blessed and names of people for Father to remember at liturgy

PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR THE BLESSING:

- 1) Your home does NOT have to be spotless, but should be free of clutter on the floor, like toys, which may cause Father to trip or fall.
- 2) A table should be prepared where an icon, a candle, a small bowl, holy water and a list of first names of everyone you want Father to pray for during the service for their health. If you do not have Holy Water, please let Father know and he will bring a bottle of for you to keep.
- 3) If you have any small items, like crosses or icons, that you want blessed, place them on the table and let Father know.
- 4) Turn off all radios and TVs. Take the phone off the hook during the short blessing service. Cell phones should be turned off. Just remember to place the phone back on the hook and turn on your cell phone at the end of the service.
- 5) Close all doors to rooms you do not want Father to enter -- open all doors and turn the lights on in the home, otherwise.
 - 6) A family member should lead Father around the home during the blessing. Children may do this, girls or boys.
- 7) If you have a pet, they may also receive a blessing, but please keep them under control to prevent them from jumping on Father or getting under his feet.
- 8) I look forward to sharing this special blessing with you and your family. Many Years!!

No one is obligated to have their homes blessed, but it is a wonderful opportunity for the church to come into your home, for me to visit with you and your family. It would be a shame to lose this tradition as it is a great opportunity for priest and parishioners to bond and connect in your homes.

Also note, that you can have your home blessed at any time of the year as can water, if needed. It is traditional to do both around Theophany.
