Food Drive for Dorothy

Day—As recently reported, the numbers of people served by Dorothy Day have increased dramatically. We are currently serving approximately double the number of hot meals and bag lunches from what we did a year ago. This increase has also cleaned out most of the stores of non-perishable items used at the soup kitchen. We will be collecting items to donate to Dorothy Day from now until Wednesday, April 10th. Listed below are some of the most needed items. See complete list of items needed at the candlestand. It's most helpful to Dorothy Day if we stick to items on the list.

- Ground regular coffee
- Canned vegetables
- Sugar
- Peanut butter and/or grape or strawberry jelly
- Canned black and kidney beans
- Italian and Ranch dressing

As we begin Lent together, the following minimal fasting regulations are designated for our clergy and faithful:

- 1) Monday, March 18 (Clean Monday), the first day of the Fast, is a day of strict abstinence; likewise Great and Holy Friday, and Great and Holy Saturday, namely May 3 and 4 are days of strict abstinence. On these days, no meat or dairy products may be eaten.
 - 2) All Wednesdays and Fridays during this entire Season are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3) Meat and meat products may not be eaten during all Holy Week, namely April 29 through May 4.
- 4) For the evening Pre-sanctified Liturgy, a minimum three-hours fast from all food and drink must be observed before the reception of Holy Communion. Normal fasting from midnight is still practiced before the Liturgies of St. John Chrysostom and St. Basil the Great.

These are the minimal requirements to observe during this Season. But for those of stronger body and more willing spirit, I wholeheartedly recommend the penitential practices of a sterner quality which the time-honored traditions and customs of our Holy Orthodox Church have handed down to us

Pascha Breads—Pani Bethany and Susan Sulich are making Pascha breads again this year for the bake sales and parishioners who wish to have them. If you would like a Pascha bread for our Easter please fill out a bake sale form as soon as possible with the number of breads you wish to order. Our ovens will only make 10 at a time and we want to be sure everyone who wants a Pascha bread gets one!
