Mother's Day—Believe it or not Mother's Day is the Sunday after Pascha! The dads and kids will be cooking up a special brunch for our Moms. If you are able to help, please see Harry Fong or Paul Sulich.

As we begin Lent together, the following minimal fasting regulations are designated for our clergy and faithful:

- 1) Monday, March 18 (Clean Monday), the first day of the Fast, is a day of strict abstinence; likewise Great and Holy Friday, and Great and Holy Saturday, namely May 3 and 4 are days of strict abstinence. On these days, no meat or dairy products may be eaten.
  - 2) All Wednesdays and Fridays during this entire Season are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3) Meat and meat products may not be eaten during all Holy Week, namely April 29 through May 4.
- 4) For the evening Pre-sanctified Liturgy, a minimum three-hours fast from all food and drink must be observed before the reception of Holy Communion. Normal fasting from midnight is still practiced before the Liturgies of St. John Chrysostom and St. Basil the Great.

These are the minimal requirements to observe during this Season. But for those of stronger body and more willing spirit, I wholeheartedly recommend the penitential practices of a sterner quality which the time-honored traditions and customs of our Holy Orthodox Church have handed down to us

**Parish Family to Gather for Lazarus Saturday**—Next Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> is Lazarus Saturday and there is something for everyone to do to prepare for Holy Week. Schedule will be as follows:

- Liturgy at 9 a.m.
- Breakfast (We will be looking for parents to bring fruit, muffins, juice, etc.—Mary Dugal will provide bagels!)
- Preparing palm crosses and pussy willows
- Decorating luminaries to light our walk around the church at the Pascha midnight service
- Dying Easter Eggs
- Grounds clean up

This is a day for the whole family! Please plan to set aside some time to come together and get our parish grounds ready for Holy Week!
